St John's Church Regeneration Project Update

The first phase of the building project is complete. The church has been rewired and the heating and lighting system replaced to create a beautifully lit, warm church. All are welcome to visit and see the results of fundraising over the last few years.

In addition, the Church has received the excellent news that it has been awarded substantial funding from both the Garfield Weston Anniversary Fund and from the City Bridge Trust. This means that it will be able to carry out the second phase of the rebuilding project next year - providing improved facilities including toilets, kitchen, step free entrance and lobby, internal ramps, storage and hopefully new flooring, all of which will be able to be used for community events in the future. Thank you so much to everyone who has supported the project.

World War 1 Memorial Research

To mark the centenary of the armistice of WW1, Spring Grove resident and Local History Officer, Carolynne Cotton, researched the stories of the 83 local men listed on the WW1 memorial in St John's Church. Using information from the Kingston History Centre and many other sources, she has painstakingly pieced together details of the lives of the 83 named men and produced a map of where they all lived. Portland Road suffered the highest number of casualties (18) followed by Alfred Rd (12), but amidst all the tragedy, Carolynne unearthed one surprising piece of good news – of the 3 Cambridge brothers listed on the memorial, one actually survived until 1967!

For those who missed the opportunity to view it in November, Carolynne's research can be seen in the in the Kingston History Centre and it will be displayed again in St John's Church, Grove Lane, throughout February 2019. The best time to view it at the Church will be Saturday mornings between 10am and 12noon.
